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I. Introduction

EnComun, THRIVE Santa Ana, Inc. and the Santa Ana CRC Planning Project Committee seek Proposals from individuals or entities for site planning, architectural and urban design, renderings, engineering studies, and related services for future development of a Community Resilience Center in Santa Ana, California.

The Community Resilience Center (CRC) Planning Project is funded by the Strategic Growth Council, a state agency with a mission to support healthy, thriving, and climate-resilient communities for all Californians, emphasizing economic prosperity, social equity, and environmental stewardship. Specifically, the CRC Program funds Planning and Implementation Grants that “advance the development of neighborhood resilience centers that provide shelter and resources during climate emergencies. It also supports year-round community services and programming.” (CRC Guidelines, pg. 2)

EnComun, a local collaborative formed by Community Hub de Santa Ana (formerly Santa Ana Building Healthy Communities), THRIVE Santa Ana, Cooperacion Santa Ana, and CRECE Urban Farms, is spearheading a community-driven planning process for Santa Ana residents to identify strategic needs, location, and overall vision for the CRC. Since September 2025, EnComun and its partners have hosted community meetings throughout the city, inviting neighborhood residents to provide guidance on the needs for a Community Resilience Center, where individuals and families might find support during a climate emergency, or throughout the year. A Summary of the Community Needs Assessment, as well as results of the community visioning exercises, are attached at the end of this document as Attachment G.

In August 2026, community participants will select a site for future development of a CRC in Santa Ana. With this Request for Proposals (RFP), EnComun seeks to partner with qualified professionals to assist with design and engineering components. This work will be used to complete a cost-analysis and pre-development steps, which in turn will help the Santa Ana CRC qualify for Implementation Grant funds in 2027.

A. Purpose for Request of Proposal

The CRC Planning Team seeks a firm, firms or entities capable of providing engineering, design, and architectural services for the Community Resilience Center Planning Project. Engineering studies, architectural and site design will be needed for the selected site, in preparation for future development of a CRC in Santa Ana. Contracted entities will support the project with pre-development steps including preliminary engineering to identify structural, mechanical, electrical, and plumbing needs, as well as architectural and site design services. A Water Quality Management Plan may be needed. The products and services rendered to this project will be used by the CRC Planning Team to apply for state Implementation Funds.

B. Background on CRC Planning Project & Project Team

In September 2025, Santa Ana’s collaborative of community organizations—EnComun, was awarded the Strategic Growth Council’s Planning Grant to plan, through a community-driven process, the potential development of a Community Resilience Center in Santa Ana. The CRC Program funds Planning and Implementation Grants that “advance the development of neighborhood resilience centers that provide shelter

and resources during climate emergencies. It also supports year-round community services and programming.” (CRC Guidelines, pg. 2)

The CRC Program was created as a part of California’s 2021-2022 Climate Budget Package. “Senate Bill (SB) 155 authorized “funding ... for the construction or retrofit of facilities to serve as Community Resilience Centers that mitigate the public health impacts of extreme heat and other emergency situations exacerbated by climate change.” This statute specifies that the program will fund: physical infrastructure elements critical to emergency response facilities during climate or other disasters; long-term resilience efforts; and the integrated delivery of services. SB 155 also requires that community-based organizations (CBOs) and local residents participate in CRC Project governance and decision-making through partnerships and mandates a public process for guidelines development to allow for transparency and public input.” (CRC Guidelines, pg. 9)

EnComun, a collaborative of Santa Ana community-ownership organizations, was selected by SGC to plan for the development of a CRC in Santa Ana. The EnComun collaborative works to build an interdependent set of cooperative structures that support community priorities and livelihoods. To achieve this, EnComun supports community members to articulate a shared vision that meets local needs, builds community assets, and shares power. Projects are owned by community members, addressing their most pressing needs and expansive visions. The organizational partners and founders of EnComun are:

- Community Hub de Santa Ana- Resident Trainer, Convener, Community Project Incubator, and Fiscal Sponsor
- Cooperacion Santa Ana- Cooperative Developer
- CRECE Urban Farms- Community-Owned Food Systems
- THRIVE Santa Ana- Community Land Trust, Land Stewardship

II. SCOPE OF WORK

A. Scope of Services

The scope of this RFP is to provide services for pre-development of the CRC, including but not limited to the following:

- Site Plans and Architectural Design
- Engineering Studies, which may include Structural, Electrical, Mechanical, and Plumbing calculations to determine electrical load, fixture counts, A/C and air filtration needs, water use, Water Quality Management Plan and Best Management Practices
- Renderings
- Site Inspection

THRIVE Santa Ana will be responsible for the following project components, some of which may require input from contractors.

- Fiscal and Community Benefits Analyses
- Permits - Identify required permits and other site readiness requirements, including CEQA-related activities.

Potential Contracted Roles

Architect: Provide coordination of site planning and design services, as well as coordination with engineering and other elements. Most importantly, the Architect will be responsible for incorporating feedback and guidance from the CRC Project Team and community participants into the design.

Civil and Structural Engineering: A Site identified by the community will be considered for development of necessary infrastructure, which will require guidance and input from engineers to ensure compliance with all relevant codes, as well as community safety and longevity. Engineers may need to provide structural and civil engineering analysis in support of the project. Outcomes might include studies/assessments, calculations, and/or consultation. A Water Quality Management Plan may be needed.

Site Inspection: A Site inspection will be conducted for the Project Team to identify any potential issues, structural or otherwise, with the Site.

Mechanical, Electrical, Plumbing Engineering: Engineers will provide assessments, calculations, and consultation around infrastructure needs identified by the Project Team and community members. This may include water use calculations, electrical load and capacity, as well as mechanical and air quality needs.

Functional Goals

D. Development Schedule

As part of its response to this RFP, the contractor must provide to THRIVE a breakdown of the tasks anticipated for each milestone, along with a prospective timeline for milestones and work completion. The following is a list of the minimum milestones and deliverables:

Milestone A—Project Schedule and Estimate

Written explanation of your teams' approach to the project scope, budget details, and schedule. To facilitate the evaluation of your proposal, use the following guideline:

- Written description (approximately 250 words) of your team's evaluation of and approach to the project scope and budget details. How will your work support pre-development of the CRC?
- An itemized budget of costs

Milestone B—Contractor Selection

Upon agreement in writing with THRIVE, Contractor will assume responsibility for a project component, multiple components, or the full project. Contractor will provide to THRIVE:

- A written and signed agreement
- Compliance with DIR and Prevailing Wages requirements
- Coordination of project schedule, access to site, etc., with THRIVE and project partners

Milestone C—Launch Meeting

- Establishing clear project timeline, target dates and deadlines for completion of scope.
- Obtaining clarification on project components, needs, and clear understanding of project deliverables

Milestone D—Progress Meeting at 50% Completion

Coordinate site meeting with THRIVE representative, Architect, Engineers and other relevant Contractors.

- At agreed upon intervals, submit a draft of any work product to THRIVE for review. Incorporate feedback and advise THRIVE of any changes to project budget.
- Any changes to project budget or timeline must be requested with clear documentation and approved in writing.

Milestone E—Project Completion

Report to THRIVE upon completion of assigned project. THRIVE will approve completed work, and the Contractor will provide invoices or other documentation for payment.

E. Contract Period

The contract period shall begin on the date of selection or another date mutually agreed upon and will extend through THRIVE's approval of completed work.

III. SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

A. Review for Compliance with Mandatory RFP Requirements:

THRIVE and EnComun will review each proposal received by the deadline for compliance with the requirements provided in this RFP, according to the Selection Criteria provided in Attachment F, and based on the overall interests of EnComun and the Santa Ana CRC Project.

Omission of any required document or form, or failure to respond to any requirement may lead to rejection of the submitted proposal prior to the formal review. THRIVE Santa Ana reserves the right to reject or accept any or all Proposals submitted.

B. Questions on the Request for Proposals

Any question about the RFP must be submitted via e-mail to luis@thrivesantaana.org. THRIVE will accept questions from applicants at any time until August 10, 2026.

C. Mandatory Submission Requirements and Instructions

Please provide an electronic copy of your proposal, with sections clearly labeled. The proposal submission requirements must be completed as stated below. Failure to follow the submission instructions may result in disqualification.

- 1. Proposal Cover Sheet (see Attachment A).** Identify the contact person for the proposal, their telephone number, address, and e-mail.
- 2. Proposal Cover Letter**—Include a Cover Letter of Introduction (1 page) summarizing key points of the proposal. Please include a note to the effect that the proposal will remain valid for a period no less than 120 days from the day of submission.
- 3. Proposal Content**—THRIVE requires that the proposal include responses for each of the following Attachments:
 - a. Statement of Qualifications, include Resumes and Organizational Experience (**Attachment B**)
 - b. Proposed Work Product Plan including timeline
 - c. Completed Project Data Forms for **one previous** project if possible (**Attachment C**)

F. Protest Process

Any contractor submitting a proposal may file a written protest regarding a decision by the proposal evaluation committee. The protest should provide evidence that the award

violated the proposal terms from THRIVE or state law. Disagreement with the final decision is not reason enough to file a protest. The protest must be filed within 48 hours of notification of the results and shall be addressed to the Program Manager and explain the exact basis for the protest.

G. Miscellaneous information

Issuance of this RFP does not constitute a commitment by THRIVE SANTA ANA to award a contract. THRIVE reserves the right to reject any or all proposals received in response to this RFP, or to cancel this RFP if it is in the best interest of our staff or organization to do so.

Responses to this RFP will be considered confidential and will not be shared outside of THRIVE's staff, Board of Directors, and project collaborators, unless otherwise permitted by applicants.

This Selection Criteria is provided for guidance of RFP applicants. EnComun or THRIVE may make minor adjustments to Selection Criteria without notice, based on the best interest of the project.

Component	Scoring Scale	Evaluation Criteria
Proposal Quality	0-5 points	Award of a purchase order or contract is based on the best value to THRIVE Santa Ana, quality, availability, delivery, specifications, terms, conditions, and fitness for THRIVE's particular purpose.
